- First person to serve as both Director of the CDC and Surgeon General of the U.S.
- Served as the 10th Assistant Secretary for Health in the Department of Health and Human Services, as Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and as the Administrator of the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry.
- Held top leadership positions at Charles R. Drew University for Medicine and Science, Meharry Medical College, and the Morehouse School of Medicine.
- Received over 50 honorary degrees and honors including top awards from the National Medical Association, the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Family Physicians.
