Writing Milestone Requirement: All students who enter the College of Public Health are required to complete a Writing Skills Assessment at the beginning of their first semester. The Assessment will identify strengths and weaknesses and highlight opportunities for improvement. Students who do not meet a predetermined score will be required to complete an online COPH 5000 Public Health Writing Workshop course. This course will address the fundamentals of good writing, writing with scholarly sources, revision strategies, and other topics in the interest of improving student writing skills. This is a non-credit curriculum requirement. Requirement approval date: 09.02.2020.

Quantitative Reasoning (QR) Requirement: Effective Fall 2022, all MPH students who enter the College of Public Health are required to complete a QR Skills Assessment at the beginning of their first semester. The QR Assessment will identify strengths and weaknesses and highlight opportunities for improvement. Students who do not meet a predetermined score will be required to complete an online COPH 5001 Public Health QR Workshop course. This course will address the fundamentals of pre-algebra, algebra, and other topics in the interest of improving student QR skills. This is a non-credit curriculum requirement. Requirement approval date: 02.02.2022.

IPE Curriculum Requirement: All COPH degree-seeking students are required to complete the UAMS Quadruple Aim Interprofessional Education (IPE) Program prior to graduation. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), "Interprofessional Education occurs when two or more professions learn with, from and about each other to improve collaboration and the quality of care." The IPE Program is noncredit hour earning and consists of several workshops and other activities. All aspects of the IPE Program must be completed prior to degree program completion as a condition of graduation. 1.	Assess the successes and failures of national public health systems in rural versus urban settings.	COPH 5146 Rural and Global Public Health Practice	Writing assignment. Students will make use of evidence combined with strong reflective thought to assess the health systems of the following countries – Germany, Japan, and Great Britain – in relationship to the U.S. system in terms of successes and failures in rural versus urban settings. Grading will be carried out using the rubric as posted for this class.
2.	Develop communication skills to disseminate the health impacts of climate change in both scientific and lay terms.	ENVH 5303 Climate Change and Public Health	Writing assignment. Students will develop a communication strategy targeted towards a specific population detailing the effects of climate change on health. Through this assignment, students will demonstrate their ability to translate and disseminate climate science. Assignment will be graded according to the rubric in the syllabus
3.	Evaluate how climate change adversely impacts population health, with differing vulnerability across rural and global communities.	ENVH 5303 Climate Change and Public Health	Writing Assignment. Students will identify climate-related hazards for a specific geographic location, identify frontline communities, and asses their vulnerability based upon their exposure, sensitivity, and adaptive capacity. Assignment will be graded according to the rubric in the syllabus.
4.	Develop a plan that uses global insight to address a local public health issue.	COPH 5146 Rural and Global Public Health Practice	White paper. Students will identify three local public health issues in Arkansas that have had increased morbidity/mortality in our state, and they will develop a plan to address them. Assessment will examine how well the student introduces global insight into plans for solving these problems at the local level. Assignment will be graded according to the rubric in the syllabus.
5.	Design an online interactive web map to enable spatial representation of data on a public health issue to support public health planning, decision-making, and dissemination.	ENVH 5447 Geographic Information Systems in Public Health	Final Project: Students will develop a final project related to their area of interest, then create and share an online StoryMap (including at least one interactive web map) presenting their findings. Students will choose their topic and design their project, with approval and guidance from the instructor. Students will submit Final Project Update assignments demonstrating progress and outlining the remaining steps to complete the project. Students will turn in an ArcGIS StoryMap as their final project report, describing the objectives, methods, results, and conclusions.
