Individuals with strong background and research interest in population-based research in nutrition, environmental exposure and cancer will be considered.

Applicants should have *an earned doctorate in epidemiology or in a relevant field with experience in epidemiology*, a commitment to excellence in teaching and advising graduate students, highly competent in epidemiologic methods, and a track record of scholarly research including peer-reviewed publications and research funding.

The COPH was created in 2001 with a portion of the state's tobacco settlement funds and was accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health in spring 2004 and remains accredited through 2021. Accredited degree programs include MPH, MHA, PhD, and DrPH programs. We offer a collaborative work environment and productive partnerships with the UAMS Colleges of Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, and Health Professions, and the UAMS Graduate School, as well as state health agencies, health care providers, business and law schools, and other academic institutions.
