- To serve as a liaison between the student body and administration of the Master of Health Administration program, bringing to the forefront the issues and concerns of students in MHASA

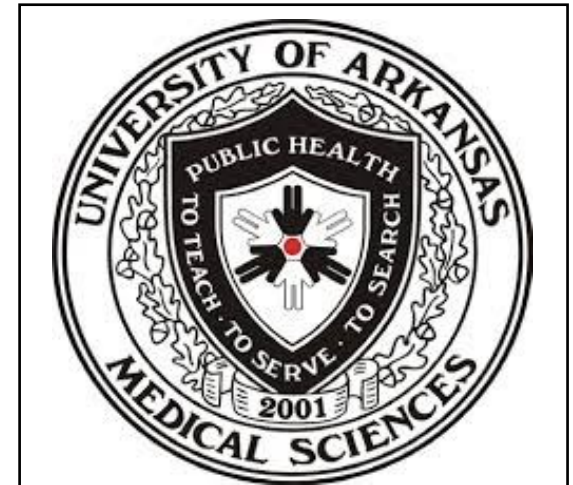
